



President's Report

What a difference between this winter and last! Can't believe that Santa was golfing on December 25! The recent rain and warm weather are a good indication that we will be back on the course in no time!

As you will see in Michael Fehr's report, our **2015/16 Financial Results** were good. We are about \$2,500 above plan this year and expect to come in at a loss of about \$5,000, which is typical for our non-profit organization. Our social initiatives contributed very strongly to the bottom line, as did our new 2015 Directory, increases in membership and the balance of our Memorial Bench program. Many thanks to Scott Laekas and all the volunteers on Social, Dave Glionna and Stan Roy for the Directory and Mac Cairns on the Memorial Bench Program for your tremendous work on these initiatives.

As usual, there's a lot of activity that goes on through the winter months. Andrea Minty has been doing quite a bit of work on putting together the front end of our new **website**. This is definitely a 'work in progress', but Sergio Mastronardi, Cindy Aikman, Andrea and I are committed to getting it done!

Last year we did some work on defining requirements for an updated **kitchen**. Although a lot was done, we decided to put that on hold while we took a broader view of what we required for the **Club House**, as a whole. Bruce MacLeod, John Vanstone and I have been working with our House Director, Pierre Demers, to consult with key users in the community to come up with specific "user requirements". Our initial 'consultation phase' has concluded and we will be sharing the results with our membership over the summer and looking for your feedback as we move forward. As we approach the 100th anniversary of the DCC in 2022, our focus is to ensure that we have the right facility in place to meet members' current needs and those of generations to come and that we invest our money in what is important to our membership.

In order to help mark our historic 100 year anniversary in 2022 we have established a **Centennial Fund**. The idea is to raise money over the next few years towards capital projects that will maintain and enhance our Club House and surrounding areas for years to come. Our first priority is the quality of the **golf course**. As you can see in Bill Gauley's report, we have been taking action to improve the quality of the course and have made a major investment in some new equipment that should help to continue those efforts. We also dug a well on the 5th hole near the Ladies' tee to help with irrigation of the back tees and greens and have purchased a pump and generator for this year. Many thanks to our Superintendent, Dave Armitage and his team and the able leadership of Bill Gauley, our Greens Committee and Golf Course Improvement committee for all their efforts.

Speaking about **golf**...Barb Armstrong our Club Captain with her team has all our **Tournaments** organized, starting with the Qualifying Round for the Markham Cup on June 16. We've put the **Grandparent's Tournament** back on the schedule for July 10, but it can be played at any time during the day. Once again we will have a "**Men's and Ladies**" day on Wednesday, August 3 – which was huge fun last year.

Treasurer's Report

2015 was a solid year of financial performance. We finished better than budget and had stronger results than 2014.

I'll review the results in more detail at the AGM as we are still finalizing the books and we'll need to review them with the audit committee in May.

In summary:

We expect revenues to finish at \$249,000 vs. the budget of \$244,000 and a nice increase vs. the \$234,000 we generated in 2015. Annual dues came in **+\$4,000** vs. our prior year. And the advertising revenue that Dave & Stan generated for the new directory brought in a nice profit of **\$7,000**.

We expect expenses to come in at \$255,000 vs. a budget of \$252,000.

That should leave us with an estimated loss of only **(-\$5,500)** vs. the budgeted loss of **(-\$8,000)** and better than the **(-\$13,000)** we lost in 2014.

The cash position for the club (our money in the bank) should improve from \$109,000 on March 31, 2015 to approximately \$120,000 by March 31, 2016. Again, this is a healthy position of cash flow for the club. These results are a reflection of the real commitment & hard work from so many people. I couldn't manage & report these kinds of numbers without the support and insights from Diana Minty. She puts in a lot of long hours to ensure the day to day operations are well managed and her due diligence with all the transactions and reporting is flawless. Nice job again Diana! A big thank you to Ingrid Gratz for putting in a lot of time to receive and deposit the dues from all of us and get those deposits to the bank in a timely manner. And Andrea Minty has been a big help managing the technical challenges we faced upgrading our accounting application. Thank you Diana, Andrea & Ingrid.

The volunteers had a tremendous impact this past year and we're hoping to cast that net to a broader team in 2016. Scott's lead on the social committee and his team of volunteers has generated significant returns with all the events. Social set a record profit of **\$23,000** in 2015! It will be tough to beat those results and that profit contribution this coming year. We're focusing now on growing the membership and expanding our net wider to welcome new members to the club. The new members also helped invigorate the club and positively impacted many social events.

Greens

Mid March and there is still a thick blanket of snow on the golf course. The weather is trying to be accommodating but there is still cold in the air and it could be some time until we are able to begin our golf season again. Golfers took advantage of the unseasonably warm fall to extend their season and people were golfing on Christmas day! Two days later we received about sixteen inches of snow and it was the beginning of winter.

We purchased a new rough **mower** late last summer and it made a much better job keeping our rough under control. We also purchased a used **aerator and top dresser** to be delivered this spring. This will allow us to aerate and top dress our greens better and more frequently as our old machinery was unreliable. We will continue to **spray for weeds** to maintain control and keep the course as it has been the last two summers, green with very few weeds.

I hope that we have a great season for golf and hope to see you out there.

Environment

As we have been doing throughout more than 10 years now, we have **tested the waters** flowing out of our golf course for phosphate content. The results continue to be good. This is to be expected, since we have continued to apply 0 phosphate fertilizers on all our fairways and since we maintain an environment band along the stream of our 8th hole which filters soil and vegetal particles that could contain phosphate and carry it to Clear Lake.

As owners of waterfront properties, you all know that since 2007 we are part of a province-wide policy enforced by local municipalities of a 10 to 15 meter shoreline band in which it is prohibited to mow lawns or cut trees. For many years our stream along the 8th hole, and others in Argenteuil, was exempted from that bylaw. This exemption was terminated two years ago, and so we were faced with the obligation to create a 10-meter band all along the stream on the 8th hole. This would have made that hole virtually unplayable.



Other golf clubs in the Laurentians have faced the same problem, and a solution has been developed and was applied to us: as other golf courses in the Laurentians have done, we have entered an “entente de bassin” (watershed agreement) with ABRINORD (Agence de Bassin de la Rivière du Nord). This agreement defines a shoreline band that respects the playability of our golf course. The agreed upon shoreline band is basically the same we had voluntarily established on our 8th hole after an algae bloom in Clear lake in the spring of 2001. In exchange for what is in effect an exemption to the 10-meter shoreline band bylaw, we are committed to inform and educate our members on the purpose of such shoreline bands. We are also committed to never cut the vegetation in that band at less than 30 cm. The “entente de bassin” we signed with ABRINORD was also signed by a representative of Wentworth Township.
