Hello Golfers, and welcome to another edition of the Captains' Newsletter. This week we will be outlining all the golf-related events and tournaments that are being offered in the month of August.

Dan Main Shield - Mixed Two-Ball - August 1st - 1 pm

This tournament is one of the more fun ones. It is played as a mixed two person team and is played in an alternate shot, low net format. In addition to that, your teammate is randomly assigned during the draw the night before! Starting times will begin at 1 pm. You can sign up <u>here</u>.

Mike Roy Memorial Tournament - August 7th - 2 pm

The Mike Roy Memorial is an event to remember our great friend Mike Roy, especially his love and passion for the game of golf and for Dunany.

This **mixed** tournament is open to **all members, including A-class juniors**. There are 52 spots available; sign-up closes at 5 p.m. on August 6. You can do so here.

It is a Ryder Cup style event where two captains will alternate picking players from the field to build two teams of 26 players. The captains will pair their players to compete against opposite pairs in match play format, where 1 point is awarded to the team that wins the nine-hole match. There are 13 total points up for grabs, so the first team to take 7 points wins the coveted Stein-inspired trophy. Over 9 holes, you can expect to play 3 holes of Scramble; 3

holes of Best Ball; and 3 holes of Alternate Shot. A sudden death playoff will occur should the teams tie at 6.5 points each. The winning group of 26 gets to share the spoils!

Men's Mustache Cup & Ladie's IMP - August 14th & 15th

These are both two day net tournaments where the participants book their own tee times, one per day, and both scores are put together with their handicap in order to create a final net score. You must advise the starter before you begin each round of 9 that you intend to use your round for the tournament prior to playing.

The Mustache Cup was donated by A.R. Wright, who was the father of Joan Gale and grandfather of Alan Morton, and is open to men aged **50 and up**.

The ladies' *IMP* trophy was donated to the club by *I*sobel Sauberli, *M*yrtle Ashman and *P*at Pierce in 1973, for a weekend competition initially created to allow working lady members a chance to participate in a tournament. It was subsequently opened to all lady members.

Club Championships

Senior's Club Championship - August 11th and 12th

The senior's club championship is a two-day 9 hole (totalling 18 for both days), mixed event that is open to people aged **55 and up.** Men who wish to compete for Men's Low Gross and Mixed Low Net play from the White tees. Ladies who wish to compete for Ladies Low Gross and Mixed Low Net, play from the Red tees. Men and Ladies may play from any tee if they wish to compete only in the Low Net Loon. There are prizes for the men's and women's low gross winners as well as an overall low net winner. Sign up <u>here</u>. The deadline to sign up is August 10th at 12 pm.

Junior Club Championship - August 16th & 17th

The Junior Club Championship is a two-day event that is open to all juniors. We are also looking for "walkers/scorekeepers" to accompany the juniors on each round. Further details and sign up<u>here</u>. The deadline is August 13. **Please refer to Captains email of <u>July 5</u> regarding eligibility for tournament play**. A recreational category will be added once again for Juniors who do not have an established handicap and would like to play in a non-competitive environment.

Ladies' Club Championship - August 20th, 21st & 22nd

The ladies' club championship is a gross tournament that is played over two or three days depending on your class. The golfers in classes C & D play 9 holes on each of the three days, while classes A & B play 18 holes on the 21st and 22nd. There are prizes for the low gross winners of each class. Sign up <u>here</u>. The deadline to sign up is August 19th at 5 pm.

FAQ's

Q: I have lost a head cover! How can I find it?

A: There is a lost & found in the Starter Shack - and it is quickly growing! Here is a snapshot of what is currently there, come by to pick up your forgotten items.

Q: A match is tied after nine holes and needs to be broken by sudden death. What does this mean with a tee time system?

A: Players playing in the match should go see the starter who can check if there any available tee times within the next half hour. If there are no times available, the starter will assist in creating an opening based on certain factors such as size of groups booked, etc, in order to allow the match to continue. Please note that if you are booked and you are requested to let a tied match through, these are sudden death and typically will be decided within a hole or two.

Q: If I hit my ball into the NO PLAY ZONE on the 8th, what do I do?

A: If it is known or virtually certain that the player's ball is in the NO PLAY ZONE on the 8th hole, indicated by White stakes with Green caps, the player has two options to take free relief. Another ball may be dropped within one club length of the nearest point of complete relief or by dropping another ball in the drop zone, located directly on the flat area in front and to the left of the bridge. There is no penalty to drop a ball. Please DO NOT enter the zone to retrieve your ball.

Important to note You need a valid established handicap in order to play in the tournaments. So keep entering your scores in your Golf Canada account and you should have one in no time!
