GOLF NEWS

A refresher on handicaps: Handicap Index is the measure of a player's demonstrated ability on a golf course of standard playing difficulty. The Handicap Index is calculated using the lowest 8 of the player's most recent 20 (18-hole, or 2 x 9-hole) Score Differentials, but if you're just getting started, you can establish an index with as few as 3 (18-hole or 6 x 9-hole) differentials. The Handicap Index is used to calculate a Course Handicap which is the number of strokes a golfer receives (ie in match play or net competitions, now using 90% rule) from a specific set of tees at the course. If you want to learn more about the handicap system and rules (haha), below is a link to Golf Canada, where the handicap rules can be found as a downloadable PDF. You can also ask any of the captains.

With the new course rating this past fall, the handicap index ranges for each class have changed slightly. Index ranges can be found on the golf program homepages and will be posted in the shack.

Gold Tees

Many thanks to Chris Hart and Alan Morton for installing the Gold Tees on each hole, they look great! These are the gold discs you see part way up each fairway, and most are indicated with a pink flag. We are following Golf Canada/Quebec's recommendation and initiative "Tee it Forward"

"Tee it Forward and Have More Fun" concept encourages golfers to play the course length that matches their driving distance. Golf Canada and the Canadian PGA are supporting this concept with the firm belief that encouraging golfers to select a course length in line with their abilities can speed up play, improve course playability and increase overall player enjoyment.

How it works is simple. Each golfer uses their average driving distance to dictate from which tees to play. The **following table** shows which tees in Dunany to use based on the recommendations from Golf Canada and the CPGA:



Driver Distance	Recommended Yardages (any course)	Corresponding DCC Tees
275 yards	6,700 – 6,900 yards	Blue
250 yards	6,200 – 6,400 yards	Blue or Blue-White or White
225 yards	5,800 – 6,000 yards	White or White-Red
200 yards	5,200 – 5,400 yards	White-Red or Red
175 yards	4,400 – 4,600 yards	Red
150 yards	3,500 – 3,700 yards	Gold
125 yards	2,800 – 3,000 yards	Gold
100 yards	2,100 – 2,300 yards	Gold or from 150 yard mark

The ratings from the Gold set of tees have been included in our new 100th edition scorecards and are available in the Golf Canada Score Center - if you play from Gold, don't forget to select these tees when you put in your score.

Bantam Soper Shield and Garth Fish Registration

You can register for the Bantam Soper Shield (U12) or the Garth Fish (U16) using the following link: 2022 DCC Junior Golf Program. Please register by July 23 at the latest. The tournament draws will be made at the beginning of the last week of July to give everyone a chance to get a current handicap.

Entering Ringers

How low can you go?! We encourage all our juniors to enter their ringers. You can do so via this link: Ringers. Friendly reminder to make sure you are playing with another player or a walker.

Entering Scores

In order to be eligible for competitive play, participants must have an established and accurate handicap. We are requiring 6 scores of 9 holes from 2022 to be entered before July 23 to be eligible for 2022 tournaments. This will apply to all tournaments (including Club Championship). Juniors progress very quickly and should be inputting ALL scores, every time they play golf (at any golf course, not just DCC). If your child only wants to play recreational golf just for fun, that's fine (it's great actually!!!) and we support that too but if you are registering them for tournaments they need to be recording ALL scores, even when playing only 7 holes. Please reach out to



Stephanie or Genevieve if you have any questions about this process. (A & B golfers record in Golf Canada while C, D and E golfers record in google sheets). While we encourage our juniors to play 9 holes, if you finish your game after 7, the player's score for the 8th and 9th hole for handicap purposes shall be "Net Par". Net Par is calculated as the Par of the hole plus any handicap strokes that the golfer gives/receives. (You need to consult a scorecard for this). Example: A player with a Course Handicap (red tees) of 24 receives 12 handicap strokes (for 9 holes) on the first 12 allocated handicap-stroke holes. So that is one each hole plus one more on the 3rd, 8th and 1st holes. So if this player with 24 handicap finished after 7 holes, they would record 8th hole as par (4) + 2 = 6 and 9th hole as par (5) + 1 = 6.
