Treasurer's Report

2013 was another solid year of financial performance.

Slightly higher fees, more new members joining and contributing to the golf as well as the social events, a great variety of popular events with a steady stream of engaging volunteers, savings with the greens committee and close management of all expenses across the board helped impact the numbers.

Look for more of the same in 2014 with a goal of maintaining the great spirit within the club as we try to conservatively grow our revenues with tight control of our expenses.

The results will be reported on in more detail at the AGM in June as we are still finalizing the books and we'll need to review them with the audit committee in May.

In summary:

We expect revenues to finish at \$233,000 vs the budget of \$232,000 – can't get much closer to the plan than that.....

We expect expenses to come in at \$236,000 vs. a budget of \$237,000 – again our spending was close to the plan we put in place in 2013.



That should leave us with an estimated loss of (\$3,000) vs the budgeted loss of (\$5,000). The club broke even in 2012, so this minimal loss of \$(3,000) is right where the DCC, as a not-for-profit organization, should be year in /year out.

The cash position for the club (our money in the bank) should improve from \$101,000 on March 31, 2013 to approximately \$120,000 by March 31, 2014. Again, this is a healthy position of cash flow for DCC relative to prior years.

These results are a reflection of the real commitment & hard work from so many people. I couldn't manage & report these kinds of numbers without the support and insight of Diana Minty. She puts

in a lot of long hours to ensure the day-to-day operations are well managed and her due diligence with all the transactions and reporting is flawless. Fantastic job yet again Diana!

The volunteers had a tremendous impact this past year and we're hoping to cast that net to an even broader team in 2014. Norm's lead on the Social Committee has generated significant returns with all the events. David's focus on welcoming new members to the club helped with our green fees and new initiation fees helped build up our capital budgets for club improvements. The new members also helped invigorate the club and positively impacted many social events. A big thank you goes out to Farrell Hyde for putting in a lot of time to receive and deposit our dues over the last few years. Farrell is moving on and we welcome Ingrid Gratz to the team as she has offered to step in and help in 2014.

Here's to another solid year on the links!

Honours

Last year we had the great pleasure of honouring two outstanding women who were pioneers in establishing women's rights and privileges at Dunany Country Club: Geraldine Palmer and Madeleine Leslie.

Gerry Palmer, a professional photographer, covered the Quebec conference in 1944 where she photographed Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Winston Churchill and William Lyon Mackenzie King. Gerry and her husband Peter came to Dunany in 1954. She was Ladies president for 4 years and was Secretary of the Board. She also was instrumental in starting the Ladies Interclub and organized the women participating on behalf of Dunany for more than ten years. All that and she got a hole in one on the 4th at the age of 79! Gerry's three children, Lynn, Robin and Peter, were all on hand to receive the award on Gerry's behalf at Prize-giving.





Madeleine Leslie, née Raguin, first came to Dunany with her parents, René and Beatrice, in 1931 at the age of 5. In 1942 her father René, an honourary life member at DCC, paid \$5 for her to play golf with the ladies. That year she won her first two 'spoons', the prizes given at that time for both the men's and women's tournaments. That started what was to be a lengthy run as she continued to play and win her share of tournaments for over 50 years. She was the first woman elected to the Men's board. After being Ladies and Junior Captain she became "Men's Club Captain" - the first woman in Canada to hold this position. Mac Cairns spoke eloquently when he presented the award to Sharon, Lauren and I on my mother's behalf.

This year we are looking at honouring members who were veterans of WWII. The 2nd Hole is dedicated to Garth Fish and the men and women of Dunany who served their country during the World War II. This year marks the 75th anniversary of the start of WWII and the 100th anniversary of the start of WWI. I am collecting all the names of members and former members who served. Match and Handicap

Spring is guickly approaching and our winter woes are fading. The golfing season will be here before we know it.

With regards to the fixture card, there are no major changes from past years, other than the Opening Scramble which, after being moved last year, will now be played in August. Please review your fixture card and if you have any questions, contact me by phone or email. Please note that 200 yard markers will be placed on the 1st, 7th, 8th and 9th fairways and that we have also suggested on the fixture card that you contact the Starter Shack to check on the closing and opening of the first tee for each tournament as in some instances, times may change.

Once again this year, in compliance with the RCGA, Distance Measuring Devices will not be permitted during the club championship tournaments. They will be permitted, however, in all other matches and tournaments at the players' discretion. We would like to remind everyone to use them for distance only and that if your opponent requests a measurement from you, you are obliged to advise them. Please be considerate of the time when using a device as all members are expected to maintain a good pace of play.

Greens

Spring is coming, or so I am told, but there are few signs of it in Dunany. The snow has just started to melt but more is predicted to fall so it looks like we will have a late start to the golf season. We have had very little damage to our trees this year, unlike last season, so Dave and his staff will not

have to spend a great deal of time cleaning up branches. We will be continuing our fertilization program and will assess it at the end of the season. We will then make a decision as to whether or not we need to take a more aggressive approach to eradicating the numerous weed patches that are prevalent on our fairways. As always, Dave and his staff will be on the course to start preparations for the season as soon as it is dry enough. Both sets of tees on the third hole were levelled and sodded last fall, as was the new ladies tee on the fourth hole. A bunker on the left side of the third hole was created and will be filled with sand as soon as possible. I hope to see everyone out on the course soon.

Environment

Since 2007, Wentworth Township has had a bylaw that bans the use of pesticides and fertilizers (with certain exceptions) within the municipality. It is worth noting that the process that led to that bylaw was initiated by our own past president, Revilla Sauvé when she sat on the Municipal Council. The Dunany golf course is exempted from this ban, but must comply with a series of conditions. One of these conditions is that we submit to Wentworth Township every three years a fertilizer reduction report signed by an agronomist (similar to the one we have already submitted to the Québec department of environment). In this report, we must specify the amounts and types of fertilizers we have been using, the amounts we plan to use in the next few years, the means we take to limit this amount, the means we take to prevent the fertilizers from leaching into streams and lakes and, finally, the results of the monitoring we make of outflow from the golf course. We now have to file our second report of this type with Wentworth Township. This report will cover the years 2009, 2010 and 2011. At this time we are, with the participation of our consulting agronomist Mr Abdo Badra, in the process of completing this fertilizer reduction report.


